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**DANVILLE, Ky. (March 20, 2020)** – As we all navigate the unprecedented, extraordinary and evolving coronavirus (COVID-19) national emergency, the City of Danville wants you to know that we always have been and will continue to be available for assistance within our purview. Therefore, the City of Danville has announced temporary assistance to residents and business owners who fall behind on their fee payments. Until the city's Emergency Disaster Declaration is lifted, the city will be implementing the following protocols:

- Interest or penalties will not be assessed to utility bills not paid by the deadline. Payment plans will be set up for any customer unable to pay their utility bills in full by the published due date. Please call (859) 238-1200 to speak to a customer service representative.
- Alcohol regulatory fees for the quarter ending April 30, 2020 and due May 29, 2020 shall be deferred for 30 days. Fees will be due June 30, 2020.
- All liquor licenses expiring at the end of April 2020 shall be extended until the end of May 2020. License holders need not take any additional action and can continue to operate in compliance of the law without penalty.
- All payroll license withholdings for the quarter ending March 31, 2020 shall be extended for 30 days and will be due May 31, 2020 instead of April 30, 2020.
- Danville will follow the federal guidelines on tax returns for net profits by extending the filing and payment deadline to July 15, 2020.
